PRESIDENT'S REPORT

When the Subiaco Districts Cricket Club and the Floreat Cricket Club combined two seasons ago, the constitution was amended to provide that during an interim period the President of the Subiaco Districts Cricket Club would become the President until the Annual General Meeting in 1979.

As President of the Club at that time and since, my period of office has now expired and I am not seeking re-election to the presidency because of my Ministerial commitments.

I think I can say without hesitation that with one or two exceptions, the hopes that I had for the Club's achievements over this two year term have been realised. I held out high hopes of a Club Championship in my last two annual reports and it is a great thrill to be able to report that we made it and became Club Champions for the 1978/79 season. This result was in no small way due to the great spirit of enthusiasm engendered by our Club Captain and Coach, Paul Nicholls, and by great support from all of the teams and by some outstanding individual efforts.

Amongst those who did so well for the first grade side to reach the final, only to fail due to some outstanding batting by Fremantle, I must mention Jim Hubble who seems to improve and grow more determined as the years go by. His effort in holding the batting together on a number of occasions, together with some fine bowling and fielding, helped pave the way for many wins which contributed greatly to our Club Championship. I specifically wanted to mention Jim's efforts because of his long association with the Club and the fact that he played his 200th game with the Club during the 1978/79 season, but I wish to make it clear that every member of all the teams gave everything he had to bring about our success.

Congratulations have to go to the third and fourth sides Captained by David Phillips and Dave Shilbury respectively for their success in winning premierships which, unfortunately, they had to share with other clubs because of an inability to complete the final game.

In addition to winning the Club Championship, the first grade side won the Kevin Sullivan minor premierships which brought some much needed funds into the Club as did of course the winning of the Club Championship which also produced a considerable amount of income donated by the Swan Brewery Company Ltd.

It has been a great disappointment to me that due to my appointment as a Minister twelve months ago I have been virtually unable to make any contribution to the Club's management during the last year and I want to say that although that has left me a little embarrassed and disappointed, the assistance which was given by the entire committee which, of course, ran the Club's affairs during the year, was outstanding. I have to make special mention of Richie Hann who has worked tirelessly as senior Vice President to entirely take over the duties which I was unable to perform. His was a magnificent effort throughout the year.

Over the years I have had great support from all the members of the committee and, in particular, the Secretary Mr. Bob King.

Perhaps my greatest disappointment is the fact that notwithstanding all our efforts, we have been unable still to secure suitable grounds and wickets and this will be of considerable concern to the committee during the next year.

I would hope that those problems can be overcome and that the provision of adequate playing surfaces and conditions, combined with good management and team spirit, will see us remain a power in the W.A.C.A. competition for many years to come.

I have been proud to have acted as President of the Club for the last three years and it is a period of time which I will long remember. I regret very much that I was not able to do more in this last twelve months.

I wish all in the Club well and hope that my successor will enjoy his period of presidency as I have done.

CAPTAINS REPORTSFIRST GRADE:

This team had a reasonably successful season in improving from equal 8th in 1977-1978 to runners-up in this season.

Narrow wins in several games paved the way for the team's rise up the ladder. For example, against West Perth and Melville we passed their respective scores with nine wickets down and against Midland/Guildford and Fremantle we won by nine and seven wickets respectively.

Paul Nicholls was a successful and popular captain. He also was the backbone of the team's batting - 667 runs in a season speaks for itself. Jim Hubble provided the reliability in the middle-order batting. Jim made 508 runs at 36.28. Jim played his 200th first grade pennant game for Subiaco and Subiaco/Floreat during the season - tremendous feat. Terry Alderman and Ian King probably rank as the best opening attack in the competition. Terry won the competition averages and provided penetration; whereas our other veteran, Ian King bowled tirelessly and was rewarded by a phenomenal 7/15 in 6.5 overs against Nedlands to bowl us to outright victory. Graeme Porter's batting produced 354 runs at 32.18 and his best innings was 97 against Midland/Guildford on a badly rain-affected wicket when he steered the side to victory. Giles Bush emerged as a first grade leg-spinner of quality and Ray Elliott in the latter half of the season showed that he has the makings of a fine middle order batsman. It was disappointing to see Kevin Sharp return to Yorkshire with a back injury as he started the season in great form. Chris Perrott had an improved season. Glen Hughes made a grand 82 against Fremantle but generally lacked the concentration necessary to compile larger scores commensurate with his ability. Players such as Reg Statham, Harold Christensen, Paul Anthony, Neil Bolton, Geoff Hann, Greg Burgess and John Davies generally made valuable contributions when called upon and provided the strength in depth required to maintain a high ranking on the premiership table.

SECOND GRADE

This team finished in sixth position winning 8 games and losing 5 games. Three games were lost by 10 runs or less and a win from any one of these games would have given the team a place in the finals.

The team found it difficult to develop into a consolidated unit as many changes were made during the season. Twenty three players were used during the season and the performance of the younger players indicated a supply of talent for the First Grade in coming seasons.

The batting performed consistently and averaged a creditable 233 runs per game. The bowling also performed consistently dismissing the opposition for an average of 173 runs per innings. Young players worthy of mention are Warren Ralph, John Mazza and John Davies.

THIRD GRADE

Many young players playing their first season of senior cricket combined with two or three experienced players to enable this team to be joint winners of the Third Grade Premiership.

The batting of the team was highlighted by the consistency of Warrick Sharp who won the average for the season. Stephen Mulhall realised part of his unused potential by scoring heavily in the last part of the season. He scored a magnificent 168 in the preliminary fixtures and 91 in the Grand Final. Greater dedication from this player would ensure Stephen success in First Grade as he is an extremely talented player.

Bowling performances during the season were well spread. Bart Houwen and Dave Phillips were experienced bowlers who took 35 wickets between them. Brad Lohar showed his future potential by taking 32 wickets at 14.50 to win the averages.

The spirit and success of this team was at a high level during the season and the success should ensure the success of the higher grade teams in seasons to come.

FOURTH GRADE

After a slow start to the season, the fourth grade side gradually bonded into a very strong combination and went on to share the Premiership with Claremont-Cottesloe.

David Shilbury, in his first year of Captaining a senior side, proved himself to be a capable leader both on and off the field.

In the batting department the side was well served during the year with six players scoring in excess of 200 runs. John Fitzgerald (340) Shilbury (374) Larry King (313) Darryl Mansfield (249) S.J. Wright (245) and S.T. Wright (206) all performed consistently throughout the year.

The bowling honours for the year went to Brian Raven who took 40 wickets and showed that he has a very bright future with the Club. Phil Haydon (20 wkts.) Murray Raven (23 wkts.) John Mumme (17 wkts.) Dave Silbury (17 wkts.) all did their part in dismissing the opposition with relative ease throughout the season.

FIFTH GRADE

The 1978/79 season was the second in which the Club has entered a team in the W.A. Suburban Turf Competition. After finishing on top of the ladder in the previous season, the side was promoted to 5th grade and again finished in the top four. Thirty two players, many of whom were new to the Club, contributed to the side's success.

The "5ths" were well served by their bowlers during the season with several fine individual performances. Peter Hugo took 30 wickets at 8.0 in his first season with the Club, whilst Mark Donovan's 38 wickets were gained at an average of only 10.16. (this included 6/38 and 7/101 in the semi-final) The "workhorse" of the side, Wayne Davies, took 42 wickets at 12.81 from an incredible 163.4 overs (he set the scene in the first game with an 8/13 performance.)

Unfortunately the batsmen weren't quite as consistent, although good performances were obtained from promising young players Stuart Smith, John Worthy and Rick Crosara. Steve Wright's 113 n.o. was a noteworthy performance, and once again John Caldow, Daryl Mansfield and John Howieson proved how reliable they are under pressure. Philip Bailey also showed he has quite a talent for keeping wickets.

The experience gained by the younger players during the year should enable the side to go even better in the 1979/80 season.
