## FIRST GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

After finishing in the final four in the previous year there were expectations that the 1991/92 season would bring bigger and better results. However, a disastrous finish to the year ended any such hopes in what was a disappointing season for the 'A' grade.

Despite some inconsistent performances, we were well placed (in 4th position) in the BHP League with three games remaining and were undefeated in the Toyota Cup competition and through to the quarter-final. At this point in time I thought we would give it a "good shake" if we could find our game and play with a little more conviction. History now tells us that we lost to Mt. Lawley in the quarter final and that three consecutive losses in the BHP League saw us slip down to 7th position.

Our batting was once again not up to the standard required by a top 'A' grade team. We only exceeded 250 runs on three occasions during the season and still lost all of these games. There were no individual hundreds made and there was not even a single one hundred partnership all year. There were no "disastrous" batting performances as indicated by our lowest score for the (in a completed innings) of 180. We consistently scored in the 180 to 210 range. Last year we were able to defend these scores on virtually every occasion. This year we unrealistically expected the bowlers to win games for us again. As we found out, our scores were inadequate on the good batting wickets.

To increase our scores from the 180 mark to defendable scores, our batsmen needed to convert 30's to 70's and 80's. Too many players have been getting to 30 and resting on their laurels, thinking they have done their job.

Our bowling attack was potentially one of the best in the 'A' grade competition. We saw glimpses of this potential throughout the year but not on a consistent basis. Our failure to consistently keep pressure on the opposition batsmen for a sustained period was the major difference between our bowling in the current year and the prior year.

On a brighter note, there were some encouraging performances throughout the year. Two "new" boys at the Club, Clint (Taurus) Auty and Joe Piomelli, led the way in the bowling and batting stakes respectively. Both players joined Subiaco-Floreat at the start of the season and quickly made their presence felt on and off the field. Clint had a very successful year culminating in a top side finish in the Olley Cooley medal and his 26 wickets at 19.61 included three hauls of five or more wickets. From limited opportunities, Joe Piomelli performed admirably with the bat and finished with 312 runs at 39. Joe's presence added stability to our middle order and with a little more work on the pull shot will be an even bigger force next year.

The figures show that the remainder of our batting was somewhat fragile with only the captain (309 at 34) and Murray Goodwin (310 at 31) averaging above 30.

Congratulations are extended to Murray Goodwin who successfully represented Western Australia in the U/19's and colts team which toured South Africa. We wish Murray all the best at the cricket academy next year and hope that he returns to Subiaco-Floreat next season an even better player.





In the bowling department, our major contributors other than Clint were Peter Capes, Gavin Swan and Jeremy Allen. Peter Capes was the backbone of our attack and bowled far better than his figures indicate, and he showed that he is still capable of performing successfully at state level. Jeremy Allen showed he is capable of developing into a quality all rounder if he continues to work on both his batting and bowling.

Finally, a few thankyou's. Firstly, to the coach, Don Weir, who I would like to thank on behalf of the rest of the players for his continued support and guidance. To my vice-captain, Peter Gonnella, who was always there to give me a second opinion and who captained the side to three victories in my absence. I would also like to thank Graham Leacs for his reliable scoring and endless jar of chewies and Jim Rule who has now given Subiaco-Floreat a reputation for having "the best rolls" in the competition.

Off field highlights during the year included the "dog eat dog" team dinners at "Miranda's". Despite scaring away half of the restaurant's clientele and soiling a few of the restaurant walls, "Wincent" and the Subi boys are still considered to be "number one customer". If the same "fight" exhibited at Miranda's can be taken onto the field next year I'm sure the 1992/93 season will be one to remember.

## 2nd GRADE REPORT

The 1991-92 season can be divided into three parts, a poor start, a fantastic second half, and a very disappointing semi-final loss.

The season started badly for the seconds, after the completion of the first six games we had only two wins on the board and were languishing hopelessly near the bottom of the ladder. Of the four games lost during this period we should have won at least three of these. For example we had Bayswater-Morley 5/115 after we had made 205 and lost, then we had Gosnells 6/179 chasing 262 and again we couldn't bowl them out. Then to top off a frustrating first half of the year we made 9/170 in a 60 over match against Melville, and after having them 5/35 we lost again — how much could one team take?

The second half of the year was in vast contrast to the first. The seconds proceeded to string together five fantastic wins in a row, with the team constantly making totals approaching 300, and at times even 400. It was during this period that second grade veterans such as Vince Rule, Martin Nice, and Glen Dehring started to produce match winning performances, and Andrew Kiely returned to the form that made him such a dangerous player the year before.

Going into the final game of the year we were placed seventh, but we still had a chance of making the four, but only if we won and the three teams above us lost. We comprehensively beat University, scoring 274, and then dismissing them for 186, but better news was to follow when we discovered the teams above us had lost.

Amazingly we found ourselves in the finals and with everybody in the team firing we were a very good chance to perform well at the business end of the season. However, as so often happens during the finals, the game was badly affected by the rain, in fact only three hours of play was possible. We lost the toss so we decided to bat for about an hour, get as many runs as we could and then bowl at them for 2 hours. In an effort to score at about 8-10 run per over on a wet wicket we were dismissed for 78. We had two hours to dismiss Melville, we started well and had them 2/6, however the pitch settled down and they passed our score with three wickets down.

Despite the near hopeless situation of gaining a win with three hours of play, the team showed great character, and everybody gave it a real red hot go.

The bottom line is however that we should have finished a lot higher on the ladder. We were in a winning position in four of the five games we lost during the qualifying games. This I think can be traced back to the inability to bowl sides out. This will be backed up by the fact that only one bowler qualified for the averages. The side learnt a lot from these games, and hopefully next year when we are in a winning position we can produce the goods.



The team's batting was a real highlight of the year with the following players performing well - V. Rule 335 @ 41.86, G. Dehring 286 @ 35.75, M. Nice 396 @ 33.00, S. Page 259 @ 32.38 and N. Rule 204 @ 34.00. As a result of this we only scored under 200 twice during the year. The year produced three centuries, Peter Molorich 130 versus Willeton, Stuart Page 110 versus University and the evergreen Vince Rule 100 versus Wanneroo.

The bowling however was a different story, and as I pointed out earlier it was our inability to bowl teams out that caused us to lose games. Andrew Kiely bowled consistently taking 21 wickets at 28.85 including a match winning 7/92 versus Claremont-Nedlands. Justin Riley showed good promise during his three games, taking nine wickets at 17.11, and Joel Murphy fought back well late in the year and became a regular wicket taker.

With the quality of batsmen in the side, and with the bowlers learning from this year, and with good players coming through the grades, the team, with a hard pre-season can look forward to a good year next year.

I would like to thank the team for their support and effort during the season. The team has a great team spirit, and hopefully this, plus consistent performances will take us a few places better next year.

## THIRD GRADE REPORT

Being away for two months of this season makes it a little difficult to give a full analysis of the 1991/92 Cricket Year.

The season started off well with one of the most remarkable wins I can remember from a Third Grade Team. After being pasted to all parts of the ground by an opener from Bayswater/Morley by the name of Kuljis (who I note was playing A Grade by the end of the season) we were chasing a score of 175 off a mere 43 overs. Then getting off to a snail's pace start we were looking at a run rate of 8 or 9 an over after 25 overs.

Significantly the player who turned out to be the big improver of the year carried his bat to see us home with a superb 79 not out ably assisted by some lusty hitting from the pugnacious middle order bat Glyn O'Brien.

The big improver was of course Tim Beattie who I have pleasure in announcing won both the batting (282 runs at 31.33) and bowling (18 wickets at 16.77) awards this year. Tim's achievements are a true testament to the time honoured theory that you can only reap the rewards if you put in the hard work. Tim did that this year due to an intensive effort pre-season which he followed up during the season.

Unfortunately for the team I cannot really say this about many others. It is in fact a sad reflection that not one player took 20 wickets for the season and not one player scored 400 runs. Many fell far short of these realistic targets for a successful season.

How then did we still manage to finish fifth being only 0.65 (65 runs or 3 wickets) out of the finals race, pushed out by the eventual premiers Wanneroo? Good captaincy? Just lucky? Or different players performing spasmodically? A combination of these things?

Well it was probably the latter however with respect to "good" captaincy I must thank Greg Catlin for his assistance in taking over the reins in November and December. I understand that he maintained the impeccable standard of Third Grade captaincy the Club has enjoyed in the past two years.

The Thirds were fortunate in having quite a number of good players during the season who played a game or two simply because of the depth of talent at the Club. Players such as Anthony "Errol" Flynn (91 versus Gosnells and 6 for 31 versus Melville), David "Harrow" Harris (127 versus Willetton), Steve "Beaker" George (121 versus University), Ross "Killer" McQueen (112 versus Claremont/Nedlands) and Steve "Whale" Mulhall (93 versus Gosnells) all contributed significantly on occasions.

On a more encouraging note however I would like to mention the promising crop of "youngsters" who all acquitted themselves well in Thirds during the season and show that they have got what it takes to play a higher grade. We unearthed promising fast bowlers in Justin Riley who finished up playing Seconds and the Colts Grand Final and Justin Swan who certainly showed an appetite for hard work and an ability to contain the scoring rate.



James "Jimmy" Tranter had a brief stay in Thirds with one score of 54 on his rise to Seconds. Mike "Hanks" Simpson finally showed his true class with the bat with scores of 62 and 56 in his last two innings both in less than even time. Alistair Barnes also capped off an excellent season in Fourths by finishing off with a very well made 35 in the last game of the season. One other promising "Youngster" was Andrew Worland who unfortunately did not excel in Thirds this year but with his limited opportunities showed enough to suggest that it is only a matter of time before he will get into the groove.

Ross McQueen made a triumphant return to cricket this year after being out with illness the previous season. His 234 runs at 29.25 including his 112 versus Claremont/Nedlands is testament to his courage and determination. Richard Catlin also improved on his previous season in Thirds toiling away tirelessly bowling the most overs and taking 17 wickets at 22.33. He was really just hitting his straps at the end of the season and I hope he goes on with it next year.

As many will know this will be my last year as Captain for some time as I am leaving for Switzerland at the end of April 1992. I have very much enjoyed the past two years as Captain and will no doubt miss it next year. I thank the players for a very enjoyable time as Captain and wish you all well in the seasons to come.

## FOURTH GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Following the success of the previous season, the 4th grade approached the 1991/92 season with confidence. This confidence was not misplaced, and by playing solid disciplined cricket the fourths finished on top of the table, winning every game of the regular season.

Unfortunately, bad weather and a severe batting collapse saw the fourths lose their semi-final by 20 runs and miss the opportunity to win back to back flags.

However, despite the disappointing finish to the season, overall it remained a success. This was because the younger players with potential, dominated our performances, whilst being supported by the senior players instead of vice versa.

Openers Andrew Worland (491 runs at 40.92) and Alister Barnes (354 at 59.0) showed good skill and temperament at the top of the order. They both made their maiden centuries during the season and featured in two significant opening partnerships, 225 v. Willetton and 156 v. Midland-Guildford. There is no doubt that they both have the ability to succeed in the higher grades. David Hughes-Owen improved dramatically in scoring 227 runs at 45.40 and his fielding was always of the highest order. Chris Payne (320 at 29.09) and David Darragh (235 at 39.17 including a century) added strength to our batting and both played some sparkling innings. James Tranter impressed everyone in the first half of the season scoring 283 runs at 56.6 including a sizzling 147 against Wanneroo, before finishing the season in the seconds.

Newcomer David Ritcher scored two match winning half centuries before being promoted to the thirds. Bernie Le Tessier, Sean Healy and Michael Simpson all chipped in with useful scores at various times.

In the first half of the season, our bowling was carried by two young fast bowlers who cut through the opposition regularly. Justin Swan (14 wickets at 5.71) and Justin Riley (14 at 11.36) proved to be too good to be playing fourths, and were soon playing up the grades. Veteran Geoff Hann returned to the Club, and using the guile acquired from playing senior cricket in three decades, took 23 wickets at 12.74 including 7 for 39 v. Mt Lawley in the semi-final. Good support was offered by Craig McQueen (16 wickets), Greg Catlin (11 wickets) and spinners Matt Kiely and Peter Farley who both bowled tightly but without luck and took 9 wickets apiece.

Andrew Worland and Sean Healy shared the wicketkeeping duties and both performed most capably. Generally our fielding was sound throughout the season.

Our results showed that we had a very talented team this season. All the young players have genuine ability, and if prepared to work hard in improving their game, are all capable of playing successfully in higher grades. It is to be hoped that they accept the challenge.

Finally, I would like to thank Peter Farley for captaining the fourth grade whilst I was in the thirds, and to all the players for their efforts during the season.

We ended up making 199. However, by not batting out the 50 overs and with a lightning outfield it was always going to be tough to defend.

When bowling we were always in with a chance, however Gosnells managed to overhaul our total with 3 wickets and 9 balls to spare. Jeremy Allen bowled particularly well throughout the innings.

With many of the squad back next year, the future of Subiaco-Floreat colts looks particularly bright.

On a zone level the Club was represented by teams of various age groups in the Scarborough competition, with premierships going to City Beach 12s and Wembley Downs 13s.

There were finals appearances by other teams which indicates that talent is certainly not lacking in the Subiaco-Floreat area.

Unfortunately Subiaco-Floreat continues to suffer because of the non-availability of resources for District cricket. This is a problem which is very difficult to resolve, when a large percentage of boys from a small base such as ours are actively involved in school cricket on Saturdays. Perhaps the current Chicken Treat clinic and the immediate influx of some 72 new players to the district will go some way to alleviating this problem.

Nevertheless, the district teams performed to the best of their ability this year with a summary of the season as follows:-

**U/13 (Inverarity Shield):** This team was ably run by Bob Gauntlett, and won the first two games played.

Mid-season injuries to Ben Gauntlett (6 wickets @ 9.3) and interstate transfers robbed the team of bowling strength, leaving the boys unable to continue the brilliant beginning to the year.

Batting was led by A. Lange (96 runs @ 32.00) and D. Bolton (61 runs @ 12.2). D. Bolton also captured 7 wickets @ 12.7.

The season was thoroughly enjoyable to all concerned.

**U/15:** Glen Bond was in charge of the 15s and the boys finished in the middle of the WACA table with a few great victories.

Outstanding batting performances by S. Wright (49.29 avg. - 4th in W.A.), R. Parkin (33.16) and C. Isles (26.71) ensured that the team was more than competitive.

The team was well run and thanks are extended to C. Bond for his efforts.

**U/17:** The 17s were under the nominal control of R. Dunstan who found it difficult to combine his duties to the team with his responsibilities to grade cricket.

Player availability (or lack of it) was also a major problem in a rather disappointing season.

Individually, B. Barnes (187 @ 31.16) performed well and R. Ananda (16w @ 12.68) finished overall 3rd in the WACA competition.

A composite of this team also played in the Sunday competition where S. Bullock bowled well for 6 wickets at 9.3 each.

Regardless of any of the factors, Saturday morning cricket will always be difficult for the Club unless a strong base of non-private school players can be established.
