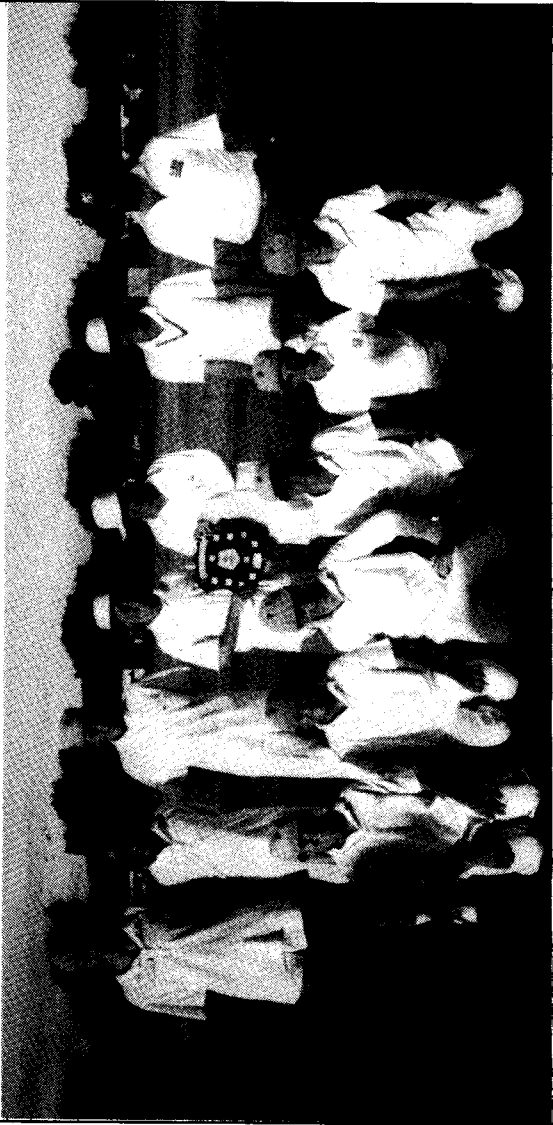

FIRST GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 1992/93 season would be one the A-grade would prefer to forget, having finished last with only two wins from 12 attempts.

It would be remiss of me to sweep our collective performances under the carpet and ignore what transpired.

In brief, the failure of the batsmen to score consistently cost us many opportunities to create a contest. The bowlers fared better, but they too struggled on occasions.

From our 12 first innings results in the Mt Newman League, the Subi-Floreat batsmen produced 2165 runs at 28.25 per wicket, or 221.33 runs per game.

A glaring factor in these statistics is the difference of only 40-odd runs per game between Subi-Floreat and the opposition. This means that, on the surface, the level of improvement needed to become more successful could hardly be described as a big ask.

But the problem goes deeper.

An honest appraisal of our season would reveal that most, if not all, of our A-grade players let themselves down badly in the preparation.

There was not one training session during the season when all A-grade players were in attendance, and that was reflected on the scoreboard.

Where to go from here is clear cut — either we make the small sacrifices required to lift ourselves out of the doldrums or we elect to play social cricket elsewhere for a middle per run or wicket.

With our club's survival on the line, the Subi-Floreat A-grade record in 1993/94 will have a direct influence on the WACA's plan for the future of the competition.

The challenge is there. I believe we have the natural talent but it remains to be seen if we still have some old-fashioned desire and application to go with that hidden ability.

On a positive front, the gradual maturing of Gavin Swan into a respected down-wind or into-the-breeze opening bowler and the pre-Christmas batting form of newcomer Richard Moran were promising signs.

Once again, Greg Fitzgerald's wicketkeeping stood out in a class of its own. He is without a doubt the next best gloveman in WA after Tim Zoehrer.

Several young players were given a taste of A-grade but, in fairness to them, in order to develop into a regular A-grade players it is up to the senior players in the team to do more, both on and off the field, so the youngsters can feed off their hard work.

From an overall club point of view, our social functions were well supported, especially the quiz night, international beer night and Christmas dinner.

The club trip to Bunbury was also a good weekend, despite the wash-out.

Thanks to the committee, Graeme Lees, David West and the ladies for their considerable efforts around the club, and a special mention of appreciation to former president Ron Burgess, who was a steadying influence and provided great assistance to yours truly and whose retirement from the vice-presidency will be a sad loss to the club. Hope you don't make yourself a stranger Ron!

FOURTH GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Won 7
Lost 5

The season started brightly for the 4ths, for the first time in many a year the club had an excess of players and the 4ths were able to field strong teams in their opening matches.

By Christmas, the 4ths had only lost games to the two teams who eventually contested the Grand Final, were playing good cricket and looking seriously for a place in the final four. With two rounds to go, the 4ths had to win both games to qualify for the finals. With the pressure on, the 4ths collapsed, played poor cricket and suffered two crushing defeats.

It was a disappointing way to finish the season, after being competitive and in contention for the greater part of it. A major contributing factor was due to the injury, unavailability and disappearance of numerous players throughout all grades. At a time when the 4ths should have been fielding it's strongest side, it struggled to field eleven players. Playing as the 4ths did, with only ten players does not give a team the necessary confidence it needs to play positive cricket, to win games to qualify.

A 4th grade team is only as strong as the playing depth of it's club. Until the Club once again has 44 or more players willing to commit themselves to play every match in a season, the 4ths will struggle to be successful, and more importantly, so will the Club.

This season, the 4ths found themselves winning games due to the efforts of it's batsmen rather than it's bowlers.

In the first part of the season the batting was dominated by Chris Payne and Geoff Hann. Chris scored 422 runs at an average of 70.33 from 6 innings. He set a club record score of 268 with a superb innings against Fremantle. Chris continued to score runs when promoted to 3rd grade and it is to be hoped that with the confidence he has gained from his fine season that he makes an all out effort to play 1st grade next season. Geoff Hann had an extraordinary season which was interrupted by illness. He scored 346 at 86.5 from 5 innings, was unlucky to score 98 twice, as well taking 11 wickets at an average of 18.36. David Richter (257 @ 36.71) and Peter Farley (344 @ 33.4) were reliable and consistent, while Murray Nixon (276 @ 25.09) and Bernie Le Tessier (259 @ 21.58) also had useful seasons.



Wickets proved hard to come by all season, only Justin Swan, who took 10 wickets at an average of 14.20 in three games, showed ability to crash through a side. Paul Pudovskis bowled his medium pacers well on occasions, taking 12 wickets, including a 6 wicket haul against Melville. Other bowlers who made useful contributions during the season were Greg Catlin (13 wickets), Matt Kiely and Peter Farley (8 wickets each), and Murray Nixon and Chris Isles who both took 7 wickets. In all 16 players took wickets during the season.

Overall the standard of fielding in the fourths was poor, in some players technique was non-existent, and this needs to be addressed by the coaching staff early next season.

One of the most encouraging aspects of the season, was the number of junior players who made their senior debuts for the club, batsman Steve Wright, allrounder Chris Isles and batsman/wicketkeeper Nick Plaisted all made significant contributions to the team during the season and all three should continue to improve next season. Paul Courtis and Simeon Botsis also impressed in limited appearances.

Thanks to the 23 players who turned out for the fourths during the season. Hopefully the younger players learnt something to improve on for next season and the older players enjoyed themselves sufficiently to play on.

The strength of Junior Cricket in the District was exemplified by the performance of the local junior clubs within the District namely, City Beach, Wembley Downs and Marist, whilst playing the Scarborough Districts Junior Cricket competition. Three teams from clubs in the Subiaco-Floreat District finished in the top 4 in the Under 12's and Under 13's competition and 2 in the top 4 in the Under 14's competition. City Beach defeated Wembley Downs in the Under 12's final, Marist Newman defeated City Beach in the Under 13's final, whilst Wembley Downs was narrowly defeated by Warwick Greenwood in the Under 14's final.

Kanga and Modified Rules Cricket had a good season with over 60 players participating. Special thanks is extended to Graham Stafford for the work done by him and his helpers in this area.
